Marion Goddard was not quite twenty-five years of age when she died on board the ship, City of Athens, en route from Savannah, Georgia, to New York. Her health was always delicate and she ws returning from the South where she had spent the winter. Eleanor Daniels Bronson-Hodge was an infant when her aunt died, but she recalls that her aunt prized an elegant doll with a hand-painted head, had a beloved dog named Bunty, and collected pink lusterware.

The signature on the painting appears to read May K. Cheney, 1912, possibly the artist, Mary L. Cheney, born in Minneapolis and a graduate of the University of Minnesota. Cheney received further professional training at the School of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston. She was a pupil of Denman W. Ross (1853-1935) and George Elmer Browne (b. 1871), both respected artists in Boston. Cheney left Boston to become director of the Minnesota School of Art (1917-1926).
